

THE BRAINER CHALLENGE

A INDOOR FORMAT FOR TEAMS OF 5 GUESTS

EXAMPLE FORMAT

At the end of each challenge, fun money will be awarded to each team on the basis of their achievement in that challenge and this money will be used in the last round.

The Event Objectives:

1. To promote working together
2. Communication
3. Acceptance of other people's ideas
4. Getting to know other colleagues in a neutral environment
5. Having fun and laughing together



1. Communication

The team objective is to be the first to decipher the hidden message using items given.

Each table will be given three semaphore charts and a pair of ear defenders.



2. Horseshoes


Each team will be given a set of connected horseshoes with a metal ring in between.

The team task is to simply remove the metal ring from the horseshoes – impossible?



3. Quick Fire Mental Athletics

– three rounds as part of this challenge event spread out throughout the event



4. Box Clever

The objective is to release the key from within the wooden box and to open the clasp of the lock – not as easy as it seems!!



5. Code Breaker

A cryptic clue will be handed out to each team table.

This clue, once deciphered will allow access to the safe and gain access to £50k!



6. Rocket Launcher

Each team will be given this wooden puzzle, which involves making the red rocket leave its silo without physically touching it!!



7. All in a Tangle Challenge

The objective is to remove the ring completely from the centre of the puzzle.



The Final Challenge Take the Risk

Each team will be given laminated symbols – Bell, Bar, Orange, Lemon, Cherry etc that represent the symbols found on the “Wheel of Fortune”.

Teams must decide how much of their money they are willing to “gamble” against each of the individual TWO spins of the “Wheel of Fortune” with the team captain placing the bet in the middle of their table (under the view of the adjudicators) and hold up high the chosen symbol.

After each spin, the payout of 3:1 is given direct to the team captain’s table.

The winning team is then announced and winners’ medals awarded.

Total cost for this scenario including:

- Winners’ medals
- Identical sets of games where required
- All necessary staff and equipment
- Compere, Score Keeper
- Public liability insurance cover, risk assessments etc
